HWA publications are open to all members to submit announcements or articles.

**The HWA Newsletter:**

Published monthly, the official newsletter of the HWA is full of news about genre events and occurrences, market information, publication announcements, writing advice, and much more.

Members receive an email around the 1st of each month with a link to the new issue.

Quick Bites:

You can submit your upcoming books for automatic publication on the HWA blog via the [New Release Form](#) on the Promote Yourself page of the Members Only section of the website.

The beauty of using this form is that it also submits the relevant information about your new book to the HWA Newsletter!

4. Networking Opportunities

The HWA Facebook Group and Discord Server:

The HWA [Facebook Group](#) and [Discord Server](#) are spaces for members to meet online, share information, and discuss HWA business, industry and market information, the horror genre, and anything else you'd like to communicate about. They are also great places to seek advice.



Membership Directory:

Membership in the HWA gives you access to contact information from a huge database filled with horror writers, editors, agents, and others associated with the genre.

Use the Directory wisely. Please take great care to follow protocol and be careful not to send unwanted email. If you would like to make an announcement to HWA members, consider using the HWA Internet Mailer instead.

Never include anyone with the “No Mass Mailing Please” tag after their entry.

Also, see the [protocol](#) for promoting your work for Bram Stoker Award consideration before using the directory for that purpose.

The [directory](#) is searchable in multiple ways by using the advanced search function. This includes searching by state, country, zip (postal) codes and more.

You can change your personal information in Wild Apricot at any time. Please keep your information up to date, so you don't miss any benefits of membership.



Chapters:

Mentoring Program:

HWA's [Mentor Program](#) is designed to provide less-experienced members with advice and guidance from the seasoned professionals in our ranks. The program is open to all members, and the Mentor Chairman looks for the best possible match between mentor and mentee to meet the mentee's needs.

Horror University:

Horror University has been one of the most successful and popular aspects of StokerCon. It is now available online for anyone who wishes to attend. Horror University furthers the Horror Writers Association's focus on education with a curriculum run by some of the best and brightest in the horror field.

We offer a series of 90-minute to two-hour hands-on, intensive workshops that include interactive activities and exercises. Classes are available as live events and recordings are also available year-round.

6. The Bram Stoker Awards

Each year since 1987, the Horror Writers Association has presented the iconic [Bram Stoker Awards](#) for superior achievement in various categories of horror writing.

Any work of Horror or Dark Fiction first published in the English language may be considered for an award during the year of its publication.





The Bram Stoker Award categories are for superior achievement in: Novel, First Novel, Middle Grade Novel, Young Adult Novel, Long Fiction, Short Fiction, Fiction Collection, Anthology, Long Non-Fiction, Short Non-Fiction, Poetry, Screenplay and Graphic Novel.

The Bram Stoker Awards ceremony is the major event of the HWA's year. It's an opportunity not only to recognize the achievements of our fellow writers but to celebrate the vitality of the genre. All HWA members including Supporting Ally are permitted to recommend works to be considered for the Bram Stoker Awards. This is a notable feature of your membership.

Active, Affiliate and Lifetime Members may serve on the award juries. Active and Lifetime members may vote on the final ballot.



Carefully study the protocol for [Submitting your work](#) for Bram Stoker Award consideration. Please take great care to comply, as failure to do so can offend other members and in some cases make your work ineligible for consideration.

StokerCon:

The Bram Stoker Awards are presented at HWA's StokerCon each year. StokerCon includes an exciting roster of guests, workshops and special presentations designed to help writers at all levels advance their careers. We also have a gala presentation of the Bram Stoker Awards. For details on upcoming StokerCon events and to register, please visit stokercon.org.

Registered Trademark:

The HWA holds the registered trademark for the terms Bram Stoker Award and Bram Stoker Awards. When referring to the awards in your correspondence, blogs, social media posts or in any other written form use the registered trademark symbol ®. Use the symbol in the headline and the first time the term appears in the article or post. It is not required to use it when you use the term again in the same article or post.



7. Writers' Resources

Markets:

The HWA provides links to several websites that maintain active [Directories of Markets](#) for horror writing.

HWA Anthologies:

The HWA publishes anthologies using well known editors and major publishing houses. HWA members are invited to submit stories for these anthologies, and all contributors are paid professional rates. Poetry Showcase:

Years ago, Peter Adam Salomon wanted the genre of horror and dark poetry to get the recognition it deserved. He brought his idea to then president Rocky Woods and the first HWA Poetry Showcase was born. The response from our membership was excellent and the Showcase has been published every year since. Watch for calls for submission on our blog and social media.

Agents:

The HWA maintains a [Directory of Agents](#) interested in horror or who represent one or more HWA members. Note that this is a very fluid market and some entries may be outdated.

8. Scholarships

The Horror Writers Association is pleased to offer a variety of scholarships to assist writers looking to pursue a career as a writer of horror fiction, non-fiction, or poetry. We also offer an endowment to libraries to expand their young adult reading programs.

- Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley Scholarship, open to female writers.
- Horror Writers Association Scholarship, open to all writers.
- Dennis Etchison Young Writers Scholarship, open to writers in grade 10-12 or equivalent.
- The Rocky Wood Memorial Scholarship for Non-fiction, open to non-fiction authors and scholars.
- The Dark Poetry Scholarship, open to poets.
- Young Adults Write Now Endowment Program
- Diversity Grants
- The Scholarship From Hell, which provides transportation to and



accommodation at StokerCon, a full membership providing access to all workshops and special presentations offered during the event.

All Scholarships are designed to assist in the professional development of horror writers and poets.

Applications will open on or around November 1 and close at midnight PST on December 31. A Scholarship Committee will choose the winners, who will be announced around March 15 of each year.

9. Other Member Benefits

Mental Health Initiative:



The Horror Writers Association's Mental Health Initiative aims to bring hope and promote inclusion for those who manage mental health challenges. The initiative wants to encourage a climate



within the horror genre that has traditionally focused on poor and ill-informed representations of mental illness that perpetuates stigma in wider society. In this spirit, the committee has developed the following core elements to underpin its work, and which we hope our members will embrace in their writing and beyond.

1. To promote accurate images of mental illness/health, particularly in horror fiction
2. To challenge and reduce stigma associated with mental health/illness
3. To foster a climate where mental illness is aligned with the same sensitivities and respect expected when considering equity and diversity
4. To advocate that the HWA membership conducts sound research in the development of mental health related themes in horror genre literature
5. To be sensitive to the fact that HWA members themselves have experienced social exclusion and societal stigma
6. To strive for a climate of hope and recovery through creativity

7. To develop a 'Notable Works' list of publications as good-practice examples when writing about mental illness in the horror genre

8. To invite 'Holistic Horror' articles for the HWA monthly newsletter, written by members expressing across an array of mental health subject matter and experience

9. To create online ('Larks & Katydid's' Zoom) and in-person spaces (StokerCon) for connection and community

Members wishing to avail themselves of the Hardship Fund should contact president@horror.org. All applications are held in strict confidence.

Waiving Dues:

The HWA By-laws allow the HWA Board to waive Dues. "The Board may by unanimous vote to waive the payment of dues of any member for the sole reason of financial hardship and for a period to be determined from time to time by the Board."

The Board's current policy is that we will only waive dues for one year at a time. If you feel you qualify you should write to president@horror.org. All applications are held in strict confidence.

Grievance Committee:

When members have a writing or publishing related grievance concerning issues such as plagiarism, contract disputes with publishers or similar matters and the grievance has not been resolved after the member has taken reasonable measures, the member may approach the HWA Grievance Committee.



The Committee will consider the facts and attempt to assist in reaching a satisfactory resolution. If you require assistance write to the Chair of the Grievance Committee at grievance@horror.org

Keep your details up to date:

Dues Renewal:

Dues become due on January 1st. You will receive a renewal notice in November every year. Any member who has not renewed by January 31st is no longer in good standing and is ineligible to vote or hold office.

If your membership is in not up-to-date by March 1st, the your account is automatically deleted and you must re-apply to re-join.
